


PHA project delivered great final results!

The Post Human Architect project (PHA) is ending in December 2023 so the partnership met at the final meeting in Boden, Sweden, to review the developed results and finalise the last project result, PHA Certification System. The meeting was hosted by the coordinator, Changemaker Educations, in the rural area at the tourist farm Peetgården and it also included a field visit at the greenhouse heated with the waste heat coming from a data center in Boden.

The partnership agreed that the developed results are of high quality and very interesting for our stakeholders as was expressed at our national multiplier events organised in each country. The project started with the development of the *PHA Competence Framework* based on the best practice collection and focus groups' results in all partner countries, that is describing the needed competencies for a profile of a post-human architect. The objective of the competence framework was to create a self-assessment grid that can both be applied in training and self-learning. The framework includes definitions and descriptors for each competence defined and further elaborates on the necessary knowledge, skills and attitudes relevant to this competence.

The second result was *PHA Training* whose purpose is to develop the trainees' skills, both hard skills - e.g., knowledge of sustainability - and soft skills - e.g., cultural sensitivity -, to unlock their capabilities in taking on an ecosystemic approach when "reading" a space and rethinking that space creatively and sustainably. It is intended for VET trainers, especially the ones working in decentralized areas, engaged in sectors like science, architecture, planning, arts, design, rural development, anthropology, sustainability - and their learners. In the PHA training handbook, one can find a complete course guide made of a series of activities that lead trainees to the development of a regeneration idea for a specific ecosystem.

The third project result includes the development of two innovative *PHA educational games* to foster further the competencies of post-human architect defined in the PHA competence framework. One of the games is Cards against the apocalypse and the other one is called Holistica. The board games developed by the students in game design by Futuregames were tested during the transnational learning event, held in May 2023 in Denmark.





The last result, which will be finalised in December, is the *PHA Certification System* that will allow the users to acquire formal recognition of the acquired skills through a certificate that can be embedded in the learner's Europass CV. The certificate will help the participants to show they possess the skills associated with the Post-human architect figure.

In order to obtain the PHA certificate, a learner has to fulfil the set criteria that will be assessed through an online assessment tool (online questionnaire containing 69 questions from all 10 defined competencies). A learner who passes the online assessment will receive a certificate which is generated by the online platform can be printed out or scanned through a QR code. Part of this result is also the Guideline for forward-looking European VET providers that offers an overview of the results of the PHA project and highlights how they can be used by education centers and VET providers interested in a post-human architecture approach.
